To construct ‘this’ from ‘that’:

- 1) replace initial s- with þ-;
- 2) if the form ends in a stressed vowel or diphthong, add final -s;
- 3) otherwise the stem is þiss- with strong adjective endings,
- 4) but -ss- is reduced to -s- next to consonants and word-finally,
- 5) and -sr- can be replaced with -ss-.
